Head Teacher's Message



Welcome to this bumper edition of our newsletter, which is the first newsletter of 2023. Even though New Year feels like a long way away already, we would like to wish you all happiness and good fortune in 2023.

We enter 2023 as an officially Outstanding school, which still feels very new and exciting. One of the things that we expected to happen as a result of the Ofsted grading was that we would have an increased level of interest from other schools and professionals, and already we can see this unfolding. Last week we hosted leaders from all The Compass Partnership schools in both Greenwich and Essex. They spent the whole day at Willow Dene, including a full tour and meeting the children. They had lots of questions about our aspirations for our children, our positive relationships and how we interact with families. We hope these conversations will open up some new relationships and ways that we can help make positive changes for other children and families across the Trust. In the next two weeks we will be visited by The Consortium Academy Trust from Hull and Priory Woods School in Middlesborough, as well as reestablishing our relationship supporting The Promise school in Devon. We look forward to sharing their

thoughts about Willow Dene in the next newsletter.

Hopefully, you have all received the link and been able to watch the first Parent Briefing of the term. In this you will hear that winter illness and COVID are both still causing disruption to school. COVID seems to be transmitting from one person to another very rapidly and can affect a whole class group very quickly. In order to try and minimise this we are emphasising the need to use our antiviral wipes for touch point cleaning, hand washing and hand gel regularly as well as considering ventilation, face coverings and social distance where appropriate. Current symptoms seem to be temperature and cold symptoms.

Yesterday we were informed that teaching union members have balloted and agreed to strike action. At the moment we are in the process of finding out what this will mean for Willow Dene and we will keep you informed as we approach the dates provided by the unions.

During the Christmas holidays we moved forward with our plans for sixth form, submitting our business case to the DfE and beginning the stages of planning approval that we will need to go ahead. Falcon Class

This week we ventured out as a class group into the community to go shopping at Morrisons. It was our first outing offsite and what a success it was! We will attend on a weekly basis as we develop our awareness of the layout of a typical supermarket and the different food categories by actively engaging in short shopping tasks. We will not only learn how to navigate our way around but learn to exchange money with shopkeepers in return for our goods.





Jackdaw Class

This term just like the last, Jackdaw class have been learning to develop our independence skills. We have made toast, cheese toasties, vegetable pizzas, fruit salads and even baked our very own bread. Pupils practiced cutting, spreading, sprinkling, and with limited adult support cleaning, up afterwards. The weekly lesson has allowed pupils to experience different foods through their senses with some children preferring hard crunchy foods and others soft squishy foods. All the pupils expressed their preference using their communication system as shown by the images below.

Out of the food we made and cooked we do have a favourite (vegetable pizza) and second favourite (fruit salad). We believe that with a little bit more practise we could have a Jackdaw's little chefs café.

Our Special School Nursing Team works across Greenwich and Bexley comprising of Nurses, Nursery Nurses and Health Care Assistants

leaving School Nursing to join the Community Nursing Team and her last working day will be the 27th January 2023. Grace Setford is looking forward to commencing her maternity leave on the 24th February 2023.

Nursing are currently interviewing for two new band 5's to join our team as the newly appointed nurses, Judy Le and Julia Wilshire, will be stepping up into the band 6 roles.

Nursing provides many services including:

Phlebotomy, continence advice, annual nursing reviews, support for parents/carers and pupils, health assessments, health promotion, devising and updating care plans and hospital passports, safeguarding, collaborate working with education, allied health professionals, and parents/carers.

The Nursing Service supports with the transition process for children aged 14 to 18 years and works together with the transition and Learning Disabilities teams in order to ensure a smooth transition experience. Parents and education staff should contact the nursing team in their child's school to discuss this process.

Nursing support with hospital passports to ensure that the parents/guardians wishes are adhered to when they go to A&E. This also helps the adult teams to get to know the child better.



New patient online health record launched
We're excited to announce that our new patient online health record system
has heen formally launched.

We would like to inform you of a new 'App' called 'OX Care' which will enhance communication between parents/carers and health professionals. This App will give an overview of client details, care plans and assessments. It is still in the early stages of use and is currently being trialled by a few selected families. If anyone does have an interest in finding out more about this 'App' please contact the Nursing Team in your child's school.
