PUPIL VOICE - Pheasant Class


Pheasant Class has had a busy half term, and we have lots of highlights to share.

Badger class are having an exciting and fun packed term! We are really enjoying our literacy story 'Flashlight'. Using this as inspiration to develop our fine motor skills, including engaging in colourful early writing, recreating scenes from the story and using our imagination to write a sentence about what we think might be happening!

We are also learning important self-care skills, including practicing how to shave. We have used shaving foam and lolly sticks to learn this, and we have really enjoyed these sessions. The opportunity to practice this in a structured routine has allowed us to embed these skills.









Kingfisher Class

In Kingfisher class we have two groups working with Milo the school dog. Both groups are becoming more confident around Milo and are beginning to build a bond with him. For some of the children being around a dog is a new experience. Other children have dogs in their family and are immediately at home with him.

Some of our children, who are using walkers have been holding on to the lead and taking Milo for a walk around the hall and throwing a ball for him to fetch and bring back. This really motivates them to move and helps to build their confidence. They can also hold a treat ready for Milo (who is always hoping for a treat!) and then release it when Milo tries to take it from their hands.

Other children are practicing sitting with less support so that they can stroke Milo, feel him lying next to them and also practicing sitting so that they can give Milo a treat. They have also been enjoying a second sec
