Looking forward to giving you an update in two weeks time.



As part of our school Core Priority about supporting families through the cost of living crisis, we are regularly posting money saving tips to help financial wellbeing. The latest of these have been about how to reduce energy costs and New Life Charity toy loans.



As you know, over the last months we have steadily reintroduced educational visits and working with community

partners and now it feels as though opportunities are coming thick and fast for us to be at the heart of our local and wider communities. This half term we have been engaging with Greenwich Royal Museums and have become part of their SEND Forum. Some classes visited the National Maritime Museum back in the autumn term taking part in a sensory sea journey. This half term we have welcomed the museum to school to lead some art workshops inspired by the sensory story. Using projected images in our sensory room we created seascapes. Our art will be displayed in the museum itself for everyone to see and also incorporated in 3D form into the Museum's area.

Rehearsals are well underway for our 2023 performance of A Midsummer Night's Dream at the Shakespeare for



Schools Festival taking place in March. All over the country schools will be performing Shakespeare's works. The Willow Dene cast will be at the Albany Theatre in Deptford on the evening of 28th March 2023, performing alongside other schools. School Visitors

We continue to have requests from other special and mainstream schools who want to visit Willow Dene and find out more about what we do. Already this half term we have hosted a visit from Priory Woods School in Sunderland. Their day consisted of a tour of the school and talking to our team about our curriculum, how we teach reading and our environments.

In order to make sure we keep challenging ourselves, we will be having our annual Challenge Partners review next week on Wednesday and Thursday. This will involve a team of professionals from other schools looking at specific areas of our practice including curriculum, teaching and learning and early years on this occasion. They will also look at some of the areas in our school development plan, including our family Core Priority and work with siblings.

We will be able to give you some feedback straight after the review takes place and then a report will be published.
