

We have celebrated one of our little girls graduating from the MOVE programme. She is delighting in her independence which has been a joy for her family and for us to watch and share.

We have focused on our garden area which has become and extension of our classroom. We have been using our object of reference along with photos to cue going outside. This also supports independence in requesting and/or going outside from the classroom.

We have new storage which keeps everything clean, organised and accessible. We include lots of sensory play and opportunities to explore natural materials.

We have mounted photos of children enjoying the garden area. We have made more use of our fence areas with activities including mirrors, weaving frames and activity toys.

As we start to enjoy warmer weather, we will spend more time outside and our family celebrations including the end of term get together will be in the garden area.







### PARTRIDGE CLASS
