Head Teacher's Message

Summer is well and truly here! In the last few weeks, we have been enjoying the sunshine and trying to stay cool when the temperatures have strayed too high. Even though this is the first newsletter of the summer term it seems like so much has happened already with a lot still to come, so this newsletter is a whistlestop tour of everything that has happened and is still to happen. Hopefully you will have also had a chance to watch this half term's parent briefing which will give you some more detail on the items in this newsletter.

Governors were in school last week for a monitoring morning, which was focused on our progress towards our communication Core Priority. Governors were able to hear about and see some of the new low tech approaches we have trialled this year to extend children's communication. Next week we will be having a full day of governors meeting, during which governors will see our new Core Priorities for 23/24 for the first time. Our Core Priorities are very important because they form the basis of our school development plan and outline our priorities for the year ahead. They will also hear more about our progress with our cost-of-living Core Priority and our plans for sixth form. Our week ended last week, with our 'Little Night In'. Our two groups of children and adults had an amazing sleepover at

Swingate Lane.

Activities included swimming, dancing through the decades, a campfire and a movie night. The staff didn't sleep much but all the children were amazing. For some of them it was their first time away from their mums and dads and we are so very proud of them. This week we learned that there are likely to be more teacher strikes this term on July 5th and July 7th. This is because the government have not made a reasonable pay offer to teachers or agreed to fund any future pay rises, placing schools across the country in an increasingly difficult financial position. Next week we will be gathering information about the implications of the strike action for Willow Dene and we will confirm our plans by letter by the end of next week. As you know, the strike action has had a huge effect on our ability to operate and therefore we would recommend that you make provisional arrangements for your child for the strike days.
