
balloons. We are so proud of all our Year 6 and 11 children whether they have been with us for a long time or a short time.

ECT and Schools Direct

At Willow Dene we love to have the opportunity to share our school, our provision and our fantastic children with the wider education community. We are proud of what we do and enjoy the opportunity to speak to others about it. Over the summer term we have welcomed many Early Career Teachers (ECTs) and Schools Direct student teachers to learn more about what we do.

In June, we welcomed a group of Schools Direct teachers to Willow Dene. These students are studying for their PGCE qualification, whilst working within schools across Greenwich. Many of our fantastic teachers at Willow Dene took this route into teaching. The students joined us for a workshop which focused on understanding more about our setting, our children's varied needs, their barriers to learning and we work hard to overcome them. They also learned many of the strategies that we use to engage our children in learning and how they can adapt these for their mainstream classroom. The students also had a tour and an opportunity to hear from one of our teachers who took the Schools Direct route and is now finishing her first year of teaching.

We have also welcomed Early Career Teachers from throughout Thames South over the term. They have had the opportunity to have a tour of the school and observe in a classroom for the morning, followed by an opportunity to reflect and ask questions with a leader.

Most recently, we welcomed Early Career Teachers from across our Trust, including those from Essex at Compass East. This was for our annual ECT Welcome Event. These teachers have just finished their initial teacher training and will be starting in one of the Compass schools in September. This was a full day of workshops, tours, class placements and opportunities for reflection. Willow Dene is chosen to host this event as a way of inspiring new teachers, ensuring they start their careers feeling empowered to take forward our ethos and embody our message of 'Seeing Possibilities, Realising Dreams' for they children that they go on to teach in their schools.

Lastly, we hosted the annual ECT Celebration Evening for the ECTs from across the trust who have now finished their two years of induction into teaching. We held the event in our sensory garden. ECTs enjoyed the opportunity to reflect on their career so far with leaders from across the trust and consider advice for those new teachers starting with us in September.

We are incredibly proud of our initial teacher training offer at Willow Dene, and relish in opportunities to share the amazing work we do much more widely, in hope that it inspires future teachers. We are very pleased to be welcoming two new ECTs to Willow Dene in September and to support another member of staff through their Schools Direct Programme. Good Luck to them all, they are choosing an extremely rewarding career.

SPECIAL SCHOOL NURSING NEWSLETTER

Our Special School Nursing Team continue

to work across the Greenwich and Bexley Special Schools. The current Team comprises of Nurses, Nursery Nurses and Health Care Assistants.

Nursing continues to provide many services including:

Phlebotomy, continence advice, annual nursing reviews, weights and heights, support for parents/carers and pupils, health assessments, health promotion, devising and updating care plans and hospital passports, safeguarding, collaborate working with education, allied health professionals, and parents/carers.

The Nursing Service supports children aged between 14 and 18yrs and works together with the Transition and Learning Disabilities teams in order to ensure a smooth transition experience. Parents and education staff should contact the nursing team in their child's school to discuss this process.

Nursing support with hospital passports to ensure that the parents/guardians wishes are adhered to when they go to A&E. This also helps the adult teams to get to know the child better. We have recently been reviewing all our student's care plans.

As we approach the summer break the team would like to reassure parents that any students who are leaving Primary School to begin Secondary School are being efficiently transitioned by the Nurses. Nurses are working collaboratively with education staff to ensure that this is a smooth transition.

To continue to maintain nursing standards, we are making good use of our new purpose-built training simulation suite at our Goldie Leigh base, to ensure the highest training standards are achieved and maintained for all our staff and parents alike.

TIER 3 WEIGHT MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME

School Nursing are excited to announce that there is a new service currently being piloted in the Greenwich Borough which is now open for children/young people living with complex obesity. To qualify for a place on this programme the child/young person must be a Greenwich resident and be registered with a Greenwich GP. The programme runs for a period of one year from acceptance by referral. A referral can be made from the GP, Dietician, Paediatrician or School Nursing Team. HAYFEVER, ASTHMA & ALLERGIES

A reminder for all parents/guardians with children/young people with allergies, asthma and/or hay fever to be mindful that the summer season can trigger or aggravate many symptoms.

If you plan to travel during the summer holidays, please be mindful that your child/young person may encounter different allergens and triggers to those they are usually exposed to which may exasperate any symptoms. Please always ensure that your child/young person has access to their reliever medications such as asthma inhalers, antihistamines, and Epi Pens.

MEDICATION

Some medications may be sent home for the summer break. Nursing kindly ask parents/carers/guardians to ensure that these medications are returned, **in date**, to the school their child/young person will be attending in September 2023.
