Improving direct payments in Greenwich -where next?

The conversations we have had with you have given us lots to think about. We've heard lots of detail about what is working and what's not working so well. We want things to change and improve and we are ambitious about this. So, we think the things we should focus on for three remaining workshops with Think Local Act Personal should be about the things that would make most difference:

- Making sure direct payments can be truly flexible so you have full control over how the money is spent to meet your needs
- Making sure there are enough personal assistants who are paid well enough to do a good job
- Making sure that personal assistants are not the only option available where you can have full control
- Making sure everyone involved right from the first conversation about care and support through to ongoing dialogue taking and managing a direct payment is clear about what the council is trying to achieve, focused on people being best placed to decide what works for them
- Making sure this is all done co-productively, with people and workers having an equal voice in deciding on and making changes

In short, we want to develop a **new vision for direct payments** in Greenwich that outlines this ambition both on the part of people and the Council. From the work we've already done together we'll be able to fill out the detail of realising this vision over the coming year.

We have worked hard to make sure as many people as possible can contribute to this work so far, and will continue to do so, but we think it's important to be certain and clear about next steps and get moving with them so we've booked the following sessions.
