Head Teacher's Message

We hope you have had time to watch the parents briefing released earlier this week. As always it contains the most up to date information, and some more context about what is happening at Willow Dene at the current time. You will receive this newsletter on the very last day before half term. It has been a record-breaking short half term at four weeks and four days. It feels like we have barely started the year before half term is here. We follow Royal Borough of Greenwich term dates because many of our staff have their own children in Greenwich schools and therefore the setting of the holidays are out of our control. The good news is that the next half term is longer and summer term 2 is a beautifully long amount of time!

You may remember from our last parent briefing that Royal Borough of Greenwich has decided to open a Free School for children with autism, and that we were applying to be sponsors for the Free School. After completing a pre application to make sure we met criteria, we were informed that we have been shortlisted. The next stage will be completing a comprehensive application form, school tour and interview process before we find out whether we have been successful or not. Many of you have been in the position where you have needed to wait for a Willow Dene place for your child, and we are hoping that if we are successful in our Free School application that this will give us capacity to offer places for children when they need it. We will keep you informed as and when there are developments.

Our thinking about the Free School was compounded by our January primary panel where we allocated places for September 2024 based on the Year 6 children who are leaving us. In a new development, this will be the only panel this academic year. This decision was made

collaboratively with Royal Borough of Greenwich to try and give parents some certainty and some time to plan rather than everything happening at the end of the summer term. After the first Spring panel meeting, we feel that there will be both benefits and drawbacks from this new way of working. One of the big benefits for us is that we will largely be able to complete our class lists earlier in the academic year meaning more thorough



transitions can take place. One of the drawbacks is likely to be that any child placed through tribunal will become additional to our already full capacity. The panel this time had 145 applicants for approximately 45 places. The vast majority of these applicants met our admission criteria. It was a very long and emotional meeting, making very difficult decisions. We are delighted that 45 new children will join us in September and hope that the outcome of the Free School process will give us further capacity to help.

In the last newsletter we included a list of important dates which will give you all a chance to get involved during the second part of Spring Term. If you would like to know any more about any of them, please contact us but rest assured that we will be giving you plenty of details closer to the time!

In the meantime, we are wishing you a happy and safe half term holiday. If you need us during half term do not forget that you can contact us on our emergency line using the number on the sticker in your child's home schoolbook. We will see you in one week ready for an exciting half term ahead. Thank you so, so much for all your support.

This is about a mischievous pig who gets caught up in all sorts of trouble at a fayre where he gets absolutely covered in different coloured things like milk, eggs, clay, paint, tomato sauce and more! We loved rolling the pig around in all these materials and most of us ended up just as colourfully covered as the pig though this was all part of the fun!


We have also had the opportunity to explore rainbows which has been the inspiration for our sensory mark making sessions. We have had lots of fun warming up our fingers by creating playdough rainbows and practising gross motor movements by swishing our rainbow ribbons and moving our hands in rainbow coloured rice. Rainbows have also inspired our attention autism sessions, and we have enjoyed exploring lots of coloured cause and effect toys being pulled from the bucket and taking turns to participate in colourful activities such as sitting underneath the clear umbrella as coloured water was poured over us and building rainbow cup towers from coloured cups and pouring over rainbow rice to make it fall down.

In our creative session we have loved exploring mixing colours though sensory based experiences investigating what happens when we combine different combinations of colours and developing our messy play skills. We especially liked dipping our hands in paint, rubbing them together to observe the changing colour and then making handprints during the circle time activity. What a colourful term we have had in Swan!

We have had a great start to the Spring Term in Nightingale, exploring outer space to inspire our learning this half term! We have been having lots of fun during our sensory story 'The Queen's Lift Off', building rockets together and blasting off into space to discover the beauty of the planets and solar system.



In art, we've also been experimenting with UV paints in the dark, marbling colours using light up spheres and getting creative with foil to make our own glowing galaxy masterpieces!

In January, we had a wonderful time studying

poetry for our focus day, reading the poem 'And a Tree' by Kate Wakeling. We really

enjoyed coming together with friends from

Skylark and Woodlark to experience an







immersive sensory telling of the poem, having fun emulating branches through swaying movements using dance ribbons and fans and creating a giant web of roots to connect with everyone! Taking inspiration from the imagery in the poem, we collected natural materials from outdoors to make our own tree crowns - we loved sharing our creations and being

Kings and Queens of the forest!



Sparrow Class

This term in TPPC, we have been learning about Africa. The children have been enjoying exploring different African patterns and clothing.

Sixth Form

Our Sixth Form building is nearing completion. After all the delays, the outside of the building is nearly complete. There have been lots of positive comments about how good the outside of the building looks with a Willow Dene identity being provided with our logo on the external face of the building. Inside is a hive of activity at the moment with painting and carpet laying underway and final touches being added to the lift, hoisting and electrics. Over half term all of our long awaited furniture will be delivered and placed ready for the building to be handed over to us. As soon as this happens, we will set a moving in date and we will plan some opening celebrations with our patient and supportive Sixth Form parents being the guests of honour for our very first tours. We are confident that the building will be perfect for our Sixth Form group and are excited for you to see it.

On the subject of Sixth Form, now that we have registered Willow's Delish as a business and have the green light to cater and sell food more widely following our food hygiene inspection, our café team are branching out! Over the last few weeks, they have been extending their menu and are now offering healthy salads and they have been catering for all our important visitors including ordering and service. Compost Crew have taken on their biggest project yet, transforming the area next to the fencing at the side of the building at Swingate Lane. This massive job was started by gardening club who have planted the area opposite Woodlark balcony with fruit trees and herbs as a project using our Jack Petchey Environmental Award money. Compost Crew is now working with Growing Green to transform the rest of the area. Growing Green are an environmental charity supporting our planting. Compost Crew have been digging away making all of the ground ready for the implementation of a planting plan. Over half term many small saplings including willow and native hedgerows which will look lovely and attract birds and wildlife. We hope you can see the difference when

you return after half term.




Frame Running Sessions
