

Head Teacher's Message

This is the first newsletter of the second part of spring term. We are officially halfway through the

year.

We hope you had a fun February half term. At Willow Dene Swingate Lane, we spent some time in the holidays working with Growing Green, the charity who are supporting some of our environmental projects. After our half term planting project, we are now proud to say that we have a young native hedgerow beginning to grow at the side of the school along the fence line. Growing Green kindly provided us with a wooden sign saying what is growing and we hope that we will be able to watch as it becomes more mature and supports the local wildlife. Our Environment Committee are currently supporting local bird life following their part in the Great British Bird Watch, by taking care of bird feeders around the school. Look out for them at the Spring Fling and have a go at their bean bag toss game to win your own bag of bird seed!

We have been the lucky recipients of funding as part of the Local London Careers Hub Impact Fund, which will support our Sixth Form business ventures with exciting new resources including a sublimation printer for our Forever Friends pet business, an air fryer for our Willow's Delish Cafe business and a greenhouse for our Compost Crew. The first few weeks of this half term have been extremely busy. Finally, we are nearing completion of our new Sixth Form building. This week we took part in the final 'walk around' of the nearly completed building with colleagues from Royal Greenwich, and our own staff team along with the contractors.

Although there is still minor work to be done inside and landscaping outside, we have been able to set a provisional date to move in. Subject to final agreements being in place, our move-in will take place on Monday 11th March after school with young people having their first day in the new building on Tuesday 12th March.

We know lots of you will be keen to see inside. Our first priority for visitors will be our patient and supportive Sixth

Form parents, but very quickly after this we will offer a date for an open day. We are very excited about the opportunities this new building will bring.

Our other focus in the last three weeks has been the completion of the formal application to be the provider for Royal Greenwich's new free school for children with autism. The application form itself is extremely detailed, and we have had a team of staff working on this to ensure that all the details that we want to share are included. Now that we have submitted the formal application, we are preparing ourselves for the school tour, this tour which will take place at Oakmere Road and Swingate Lane simultaneously on Tuesday 12th March. Following this we will be attending an interview and giving a presentation about our intentions on Friday 22nd March. Of course, we will keep you informed of our progress.

This Thursday, some of us travelled to Liverpool to attend the Association of School and College Leaders (ASCL) annual conference which is taking place today and tomorrow. Our Chief Executive Officer, John Camp OBE is president of ASCL this year and so we are particularly excited to hear his keynote speech. You all know that earlier in the year our children were involved in creating a display of writing, art and photographs celebrating the poem 'And a Tree' by Kate Wakeling. We will be feeling very proud of our children and young people when we see their work on display for all the delegates at the conference.

In the last few weeks all of our corridor displays have been updated. There are some fantastic displays of learning on the walls of both schools. If you are visiting us, then we hope you will get the chance to look at some of them. Look out for the opportunity to buy children's artwork coming soon. This opportunity has come from feedback from visitors admiring the children's artwork and looking for opportunities for our young artists to be recognised more widely.

The mornings and evenings are getting lighter and all around Willow Dene, things are growing. We are looking forward to seeing more sunshine in the weeks before the next newsletter.





Within the next few weeks, final preparations will be taking place for our participation in the annual Shakespeare for Schools Festival which will be culminating in a public performance at the Albany Theatre in Deptford alongside children and young people from other schools. This year our cast of performers are our Sixth Form, and they will be performing Romeo and Juliet. We are very excited to be in the audience at the performance.



On Saturday 23rd March we will be opening our gates to families, staff and local communities for our annual Spring Fling along with the opportunity to talk, laugh and have fun there will be photograph opportunities, things to buy and the latest siblings competition. Last Spring our Spring Fling attracted record numbers of visitors so we are hoping to see all of you there.

We also look forward to further visits from the British Library to Meadow class and weekly outings in Moorland class to develop our community living curriculum.
