Head Teacher's Message

This newsletter will reach you on the final Friday of this term. With an early Easter this year, our term finishes on Thursday 28th March. Children will leave at 1.30pm to enable us to make sure that all learning environments and equipment are clean in preparation for the new term.

Lots has happened since our last newsletter. We finally moved into our Sixth Form building on Monday 11th March. There is still some work to do inside and outside the building, but this did not stand in our way! A huge whole school effort made sure that everything was moved out of our temporary accommodation ready for our young people's first day. It is fair to say that everyone was a little apprehensive when arriving for school on the Tuesday but by the afternoon everyone was feeling at home and already making plans for the space. Our first official visitors will be our amazing parents who have supported us through these first few terms. Our opening morning for parents will be Monday 25th March.

In our last newsletter we told you about the Association of School and College Leaders (ASCL) national conference in Liverpool where our very own John Camp OBE was speaking in his role as President of the Association. We were very excited to hear John's speech which specifically mentioned special schools and children with SEND. We were even more excited to see our children's artwork, photographs and writing on display alongside work from other Compass schools. There was a lot of interest from the delegates including the party accompanying the Secretary of State for Education.

During the last two weeks we have been continuing the application process to be the provider for the new Greenwich Free School for children and young people with autism. As you know, place planning and having enough capacity to meet demand in a timely way is one of Willow Dene's biggest challenges. We have now completed the process, including a presentation, tour, and interview. We would like to say a huge thank you to the parents, children and young people who were involved at short notice in the filming for the presentation. Your view of the school and what we



offer to you and your child is unique and you voice it better than we ever could have done! We hope that the unedited version of the film will be added to our website in the not-too-distant future to help others find out about Willow Dene.




About my Child's Eyes

Have you completed your digital form which replaces the old paper consent form.


