This newsletter is coming to you at the end of another busy week. We are very much enjoying the school being open and using our capacity for visitors and events to our fullest extent. A lot has happened in the last few weeks and a lot is planned for the last two weeks of term and beyond. Hopefully, you will have received the link to the most recent parents briefing, which gives you further detail. If you did not receive the link for any reason, our office team can resend it.

On Wednesday night we held our first Informal Summer Parents Evening and Information Fair since 2019. Approximately 140 parents visited school to meet informally with old and new class teachers, talk and share information as well as meeting some of the representatives of our many community and local authority services. There was such a positive, enthusiastic atmosphere in school. It was lovely to see you all.

At Parents Evening we were able to meet some of our new families for the first time and to welcome them to Willow Dene. Three of our new teachers; Sangita, Danielle and Mollie were all able to attend and meet some of their new parents. They will be joining the wider group of Compass Teachers and attending our conference for new teachers on Monday 11th July. This event is hosted at Willow Dene so that teachers can have a tour of the school and spend some time in classes. We are looking forward to working with them in September.

This week we also enjoyed 'A Day to Create' which celebrated the Arts and brought together all of the curriculum opportunities for our children in the areas of art, poetry, drama and dance. Children in every class enjoyed the opportunity to learn new dance skills and choreography, try out some art techniques and enjoy some uplifting performance poetry. As a school we are working towards The Artsmark Award, which is the only creative quality standard for schools and education settings, accredited by Arts Council England. It is designed to support arts, culture and creativity which are all areas we value at Willow Dene.

We are ending this newsletter with the exciting news that we received a Highly Commended Award for our Careers Programme and our contribution to the London Careers Hub. Careers is very exciting areas for us and one that we have focussed on getting right for our children over the last few years, so we are very happy to have been nominated and to receive this acknowledgement. 
